At the Fairgrounds

Camping – Tents and tent trailers will all be in the same area. It is a nice level grassy area with clean restrooms and showers. Camping fees are \$12.00 per night, per unit (tent or tent trailer). 115V power is available to all that need it. Water spickets are also located throughout the camp area. RV’s will be in a separate area adjacent to the camping area. RV space is \$22.00 per night. Each space comes with 30 amp RV power and water, but no sewer hookup, although there is a dump station on site. If your chapter wants to set up a group camp with RV’s and tents together you can do so in the RV area. Just keep in mind you will have to pay for all RV sites you occupy.

Motels – We have selected three motels to recommend. All three have a complimentary continental breakfast and a swimming pool.
